Indiana 811 law



- Passed by Indiana General Assembly
- Signed by the Governor
- Specifies maximum penalty amounts (up to \$10,000)
- Specifies roles of Indiana 811, IURC
- Called a Statute or Indiana Code

170 Indiana Administrative Code 5-5

- Adopted by the IURC
- Approved by OMB, State Budget Agency, Attorney General, and Governor's Office
- Sets the procedure for excavation damage cases
- Provides specific details for excavation damage cases left unclear in IC 8-1-26
- Called a Rule or Regulation

Indiana 811 Laws - Statute



Indiana Code chapter 8-1-26

- Original Version passed by Indiana General Assembly in 1990
- Major Amendment with enforcement process passed in 2009
- Minor amendments passed in 2014 and 2017
- Recent amendments passed in 2024, to be effective **Jan. 1, 2025**
- With limited exceptions, IC ch. 8-1-26 enforcement only covers natural gas and hazardous liquids (currently petroleum) pipelines.

Indiana 811 Laws - Statute



Indiana Code chapter 8-1-26:

25 sections, governing the role of Indiana 811, the IURC, the Gas Utility,/Operator and Excavator, including:

IC 8-1-26-6 Definition of "Excavate"
IC 8-1-26-12 Definition of "Working day"
IC 8-1-26-16 Notice to Excavate = 811 Ticket
IC 8-1-26-17Role of Indiana 811 (forward the notices to the utilities)
IC 8-1-26-18 Gas operators must locate their facilities or else \$1,000 penalty
IC 8-1-26-20 Excavators must avoid damaging underground facilities –
or else up to \$10,000 penalty
IC 8-1-26-23UPPAC (Underground Plant Protection Advisory Committee)
IC 8-1-26-26IURC shall adopt rules implementing its responsibilities

Indiana 811 Laws - Rules



170 Indiana Administrative Code 5-5

- First promulgated in 2011
- Updated effective **January 5, 2024**
- •170 IAC 5-5-1 Definitions (Various Amendments)
- •170 IAC 5-5-1.1 Deadline to supply marking information
- •170 IAC 5-5-1.2 Description of Underground facilities
- •170 IAC 5-5-1.3 Expiration of 811 tickets
- •170 IAC 5-5-2 Notification to IURC of violations
- •170 IAC 5-3-2.1 Rescheduling requirements
- •170 IAC 5-3-2.2 Tolerance zone defined
- •170 IAC 5-3-2.3 Positive Response to excavators
- •170 IAC 5-3-3 Pre-existing Investigating Violations
- •170 IAC 5-3-4 Pre-existing UPPA





2024 811 Rulemaking



170 IAC 5-5 – Effective January 5, 2024

- 1. Revision to "two full working days." Operators must mark underground facilities by the start of essentially the third working day from the 811 call.
- 2. Operators are required to describe the pipeline being marked (size and material type)
- 3. Operators must provide a positive response to excavators, which is an affirmative statement that the underground pipelines have been marked.
- 4. Reschedules must include the person rescheduling and a new deadline for marking.









2024 811 Legislation





House Enrolled Act 1122-2023, Public Law 53-2024

- Amending IC 8-1-26
- Adds Section 11.3, 11.4
- Amends Sections 11.5, 12, 16, 16.5, 17, 18, 19
- Mostly aligns IC 8-1-26 with the recent changes in 170 IAC 5-5
- Minimal new provisions
- **Effective Jan 1, 2025**

2024 811 Legislation



- All times are as observed in Indianapolis, Indiana
- 2. Tolerance zone extends in a full radius surrounding cylindrical pipe
- 3. White lining through electronic means allowed
- 4. 2 full working days extends to 7 am of the next working day
- 5. Delayed start date at option of excavator up to 10 days
- 6. Expiration date of ticket at 11:59 pm of the 20th day
- 7. Positive response by operator.
- 8. Positive Response by excavator



Indiana Code 8-1-26-11.3





1. 1. All times are as observed in Indianapolis, Indiana

Same as in rule

Times include:


- Time ticket should be located (7:00 am)
- Expiration of ticket (11:59pm)

Indiana Code 8-1-26-11.4



2. Tolerance zone extends in a full radius surrounding cylindrical pipe

- Same as rule
- "pot-holing" includes below and around the pipeline



Indiana Code 8-1-26-11.5





3. White lining through electronic means allowed

In addition to rule

Indiana Code 8-1-26-12

IURC

4. "2 full working days" extends to 7 am of the next working day

Same as rule

"7:00 a.m. prevailing time on the next working day that follows the elapse of two full working days"



Indiana Code 8-1-26-12(e)



- 5. Delayed start date at option of excavator up to 10 days
- In addition to rule
- 811 Notice must contain starting date and time, if known, up to 10 days after the 811 notice
- Delayed start date means locates are not due until start date
- Delayed start is a benefit to the utility. Is there a benefit to the excavator?



2024 Upcoming Rulemaking



6. Expiration date of ticket at 11:59 pm of the 20th day

- Same as previous IURC Rule
- 811 Tickets have always expired after 20 days
- 811 Tickets expire at **11:59 p.m.** on the 20th day, regardless of what time the ticket was requested.
- The 20 days counts from the day the ticket is requested, <u>not</u> the day the facilities are located

Indiana Code 8-1-26-18(g)



7. Positive response by operator.

- Same as IURC Rule
- Requires gas utilities to provide
- "positive response" to Indiana 811



Enforceable as a violation at the option of the IURC



Indiana Code 8-1-26-18(n)



- 8. Positive Response by excavator
- In addition to the IURC Rule
- Excavators required to provide positive response to 811 that the excavator received the operator's positive response.
- Not enforceable in any way.
